## TSGLI ADL Standards for Continence

Please note the following examples are for illustrative purposes only and are not intended to be all inclusive.

## Continence

- > To meet the ADL standard for Continence, you must:
  - If you have a colostomy bag or catheter require the assistance of another person to change and manage your colostomy bag, or catheter.
  - If you do not have a colostomy bag or catheter Do not have complete control over your bowel and/or bladder functions.

## **Continence Examples**

- <u>Unable</u> to Maintain Continence Independently
  - you have a catheter/colostomy bag and are unable to change and clean it, and dispose of waste.
  - You soul your underwear with urine or feces on a daily basis.
- Able to Maintain Continence Independently
  - o you have a catheter/colostomy bag and are able to change and clean it, and dispose of
  - o You have urinary leakage once a week in your underwear.
